several years, Denomination Day offerings made to the Historical Foundation have gone to fund this new monument. This is the final year of that campaign. 200 years ago, Finis Ewing, Samuel McAdow, and Samuel King were ordinary men doing their best to serve God and their congregations in the face of remarkable events at an extraordinary time. They believed that the Spirit of the Lord was manifest in the Great Revival and they felt helpless to resist that Spirit.

Opposing conservative voices, equally sincere, decried the revival as human excess, the trickery of charlatans, and the delusion of fools. Between the spirit of revival and denial there would be no reconciliation, no compromise, no middle ground. Our spiritual ancestors recognized that if they were to continue to serve their churches they must reform Cumberland Presbytery despite opposition from Transylvania Presbytery and Kentucky Synod of the Presbyterian Church. It was this necessity that found three Presbyterian ministers in rural Dickson County, Tennessee, on 4 February, 1810.
